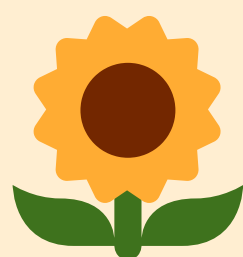
Decretum reassumptione causae

April 20, 1924

Letters of postulation asking for the canonization of Julie are sent to Rome with documents regarding two miracles attributed to her intercession.

July 23, 1924

The decree "to restart the cause" of Julie is published. The Postulator of the cause is Monsignor Hubert Noots (the Abbot General of the Order of Prémontrés).



Primo Miraculo

January 17, 1958

Julie is acknowledged to be responsible for the cure of Otacilio Ribeiro. Shortly thereafter, after the validation of the miracle, Mother Josepha de Saint François transfers the motherhouse of the sisters to Rome which facilitates exchanges between the new Postulator of the Cause, Reverend Father Ugo Märton.

Canonisation

June 22, 1969

Julie's canonization by Pope Paul VI takes place in the Basilica of Saint Peter of Rome in the presence of more than 800 Sisters of Notre Dame. Saint Julie is also celebrated in Cuvilly on July 5, 1969, and at Namur on October 5, 1969.



Search for Two Miracles

1924-1968

The recognition of a miracle is subject to strict rules. Among the hundreds in the dossiers, only four are examined by the Sacred Congregation of Rites (and two will finally be recognized in 1958 and 1967):

- in 1924: Jean Dantine (Namur) and Homère Rhodius Deville (Namur)
- in 1937 : Loretto Carroll Inderrieden (Cincinnati)
- in 1953: Otacilio Ribeiro (Brazil)
- in 1960: reexamination of the case of Homère Rhodius Deville

Secondo Miraculo

March 10, 1967

For the first time, a lawyer of the Consistory (Giovanni-Battista Ferrata, nephew of Cardinal D. Ferrate who had been the protector of the Congregation at the time of the beatification) succeeds in obtaining a reversal of the first ruling of the Medical Consultation: the cure by the intercession of Homère Rhodius!
