

# VENERABLE JULIE

IN 1883, THE FILE FOR JULIE'S CAUSE IS  
BROUGHT TO ROME.

## Letters of Postulation

**April 3, 1885**

Monsignor Virili (postulator of the cause in Rome) announces that he received the letters of postulation in which the bishops and members of the Church, princes and kings recalled the life, the virtues and the miracles of Julie. They all urgently asked the Pope to introduce the cause of Julie's beatification and canonization.

## Julie's Cause is Accepted by the Pope

**June 26, 1889**

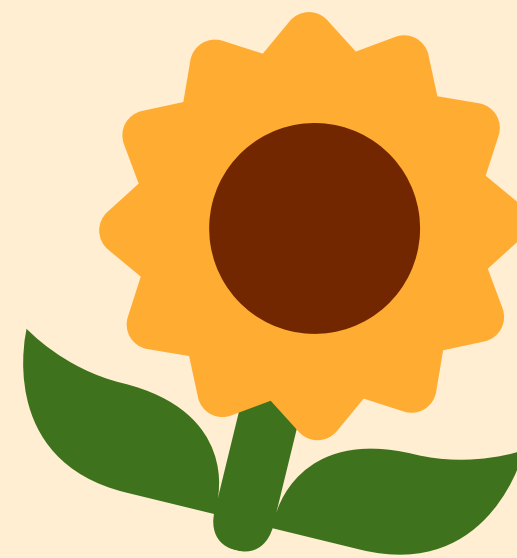
After an examination of the dossier by the Sacred Congregation of Rites, Pope Leo XIII signs the decree of introduction of Julie's cause. She becomes venerable.



## Pontifical Approval of the Miracles

**November 24, 1905**

Julie is recognized as being responsible for 3 cures. On December 10, 1905, Pope Pius X signs the decree on the miracles. The beatification of Julie can take place!



## Depositions and Testimonies

**1881-1889**

Many sisters and contemporaries of Julie (abbots, former boarders of the schools, Julie's family members, etc...) left us testimonials regarding Julie; these latter are preserved in the Archives of the Congregation in Namur.

## Apostolic Process

**1890-1897**

On May 27, 1890, the apostolic process on the life, virtues and the miracles of Julie opens at Namur with Monsignor Bélin, Bishop of Namur (delegated by the Sacred Congregation of Rites). The apostolic process ends on April 12, 1897. On July 2, 1897, Cardinal D. Ferrata is named Protector of the Institute of the Sisters of Notre Dame. Six years later, the decree on the heroism of Julie's virtues is published.
